THERE'S A 'YES' ON YOUR LIFE

“Whatever God has promised gets stamped with the Yes of Jesus ...”

(2 Corinthians 1:20)

There is one thing that is a sure thing; and that is the promises of God are a done deal. The promises of God are the title-deeds of His Heavenly Estate. They are a well guarded room in which our crown treasures are preserved. The word ‘promise’ occurs no less than 65 times in the New Testament alone. Only 2 of these instances refer to human promises. All the rest are vows that God makes to you.

It's one thing to know what God has said about you and it's another to Believe and Receive it. Perhaps right now you are thinking: *‘I've been praying and claiming my promises straight from the Bible, but it still didn't come true. Why doesn't God keep His promises for me as He did to Abraham, Joseph, etc.?’* Maybe you're going through a divorce or relational-split or some family quarrel or a health situation or a career crisis or financial fears or something else. How do you continue believing God when you feel like throwing in the towel?

Now, you might have heard most preachers saying: *‘All God's promises in the Bible, were made to the Israelites or Jews; but not to everybody’*. You need to know that the enemy will often cause you to let your reasoning get in the way of your faith. The scripture says *“... through Christ Jesus, the blessing (promise) to Abraham might come upon the Gentiles, so that we (you and me), through faith might all receive the realization of the promise of the Holy Spirit”* (Galatians 3:14). It doesn't matter if you're an Israelite or not; it's only through faith that you can receive the realization of every promise in the Bible, upon your life.

That's why the scripture says *“Whatever God has promised gets stamped with the Yes of Jesus ...”* (2 Corinthians 1:20). God has already said: ‘Yes’ on your finances, ‘Yes’ on your healing, ‘Yes’ on your house, ‘Yes’ on your car, ‘Yes’ on your marriage, ‘Yes’ on your children, ‘Yes’ on your business success, ‘Yes’ on your ministry; but He's just waiting on you to get into an agreement with Him. Jesus said *“... believe that it is granted to you, and you will get it”* (Mark 11:24). Believe that whatever you've been praying for; is already granted to you, and then you will get it. A gift is not a gift, until it's received. Remember, God has already said ‘YES’.
